SECRETARY'S REPORT

I have now had time to reflect on the Association's achievements over the years, as set out in the 90th Anniversary Gazette. This has made me rather proud to have been elected to the Committee of Management as Secretary, and focuses my efforts on maintaining the spirit and standing of the **Retired and Former Police Association.**

Paul BISCOE, Peter RANKIN and Tony DUNN have now moved on, but most of the C.O.M. have been in place for a number of years; some more than twenty. A lot of effort has gone into deliberating, negotiating, drafting and executing plans and achieving worthwhile change to benefit the Members. Archiving those efforts has arisen as a priority.

I commend to you the efforts of Paul BISCOE and Peter RANKIN, who are both Life Members of our Association, having spent the whole time since their respective retirements serving the RFPA Committee of Management, and those of each of the C.O.M. Members, who continue to concentrate on the Association's aims, in particular your personal welfare.

COMMUNICATING WITH YOU:

Your newly-constituted Committee of Management has embarked on upgrades to our communications, with a view to making all information accessible to all Members without depending on email systems. We have discovered I.T. limitations which are widening as various commercial entities go their own ways with new technology, and particularly when they fail to support commonly-used personal email systems and when compatibility issues arise as these systems and programs receive regular commercial overhauls and protections.

Put simply, when upwards of 4,000 emails are sent to our membership as individuals, you can guarantee that several hundred will fail to reach their destinations, for reasons outside our control. We have decided to upgrade now, and to future-proof the system as much as we can.

What is proposed is a process which will deliver information to where you can access it as it arrives. This includes same-day service from several sources, including NSWPF, through policy and process changes which have been made specifically to help us. Your ability to access it will depend only on whether you have a device which can access the internet. This is already the case for the receipt of email messages.

You will simply access the RFPA website and go to 'NEWS', where day-to-day information will be listed, taking the place of email messages. All funeral information where known will be posted in real time, and when it is no longer required, it will transfer to the 'VALE' file on the home page. Careful consideration is in process regarding the important issue of privacy.

The changes will require you to access the webpage, rather than your email feed, and should otherwise be seamless, and far more reliable than awaiting the 'steam-driven' processes now offered by the various programs and servers. Reliability will be enhanced, and the time factor will be greatly reduced owing to the lack of need for double handling and re-addressing by our many Branch Secretaries, and yours truly. The efforts of the Commander, Police Protocol Unit to establish policy which will give us early access to more detailed information are greatly appreciated. Many thanks to Chief Inspector Paul SMITH.

As an entirely new facility, Facebook will shortly become part of our information system, allowing for new ways of exhibiting graphics, images, advertising and the like for the benefit of Members.

BRANCH GRANTS:

The long-established process of making grants to Branches to assist with socialising and welfare arrangements was delayed however, by the time you read this, your branch should have received their payment.

Want to congratulate you both for your outstanding support to our magazine. Unfortunately the members I know are mainly mentioned in the Vale pages these days as I am now well into my eighties.

I would like to take you back to 1960 when I was a new Constable stationed at Clarence Street. The uniform of that day was a hopsack fabric for summer and a heavy cloth tunic for winter. We were issued with three shirts with detachable collars. This saved washing and only needed the collar washed and starched and then clipped on with studs. Some said you could clean the collar without washing by use of a pencil erasure to remove grime. I did not try that.

Then there was a Beretta automatic pistol and handcuffs with a leather holster and large waist belt to hold them. Also issued was cap and white pith helmet. A black cloth bag was used to carry the headwear not worn. (Weather conditions).

There was no paid overtime in 1960 and any such time worked could be accrued and then taken off on the basis of equal hour for hour. I was not eligible for leave until the following year so I decided I would volunteer for extra duty to accrue enough days off because I was getting married later that year. I clearly remember one of my regular volunteer duties was supervision at the Sunday afternoon at the Sydney Domain. A walk from Clarence Street, in full uniform & Pith hat, I would arrive shortly after midday and then oversee the large number of mixed people gather to watch the antics of several speakers and others who would yell and rave from their soap boxes. There was never any trouble and I am sure those attending were encouraged by the presence of a roving young Constable. I actually got to know many of the regulars. Also in attendance were a number of buskers who would do their best to entertain the crowd with a possible coin reward.



There was this old man who would sit in his cane chair and play the violin. He had a couple of dogs who wore sunglasses and caps and laid on the grass. Also a few budgies who perched on his bow. The chair had seen better days and his clothes were tattered but he seemed healthy enough. As he sat there playing the violin I noticed that a large portion of his genitals had fallen out of his trousers and down through the bottom of the chair to be visible to women and children standing in the crowd. I knew I had to do something. So I took off my helmet and then crept around behind the old fellow without any panic. Then I leaned down and spoke into his ear in a very clear manner. I said, "Do you know your balls are hanging down through the bottom of the old cane chair?" He quickly replied" No I don't but if you can hum a few lines I'm sure I'll pick it up."

I write again to protest, complain or perhaps draw attention to the changing face of the NSW Police Force. I joined as a Police Cadet (by law a member of the NSW Police) and was sworn in as a Constable in 1952.

I retired after 37 years and to use an old cliché "one never stops being a policemen" even though my baton and cuffs are now on issue to another young buck or doe. In my time there was constant criticism of the strict seniority system for promotion and now that a new system has been installed in its stead, I question our progress for reasons too many to mention here.

I regularly attend my local RFPA meetings, read the Police publications that come my way, read newspapers and listen to the radio and am very sad at the current perception that all is not well in the Service. For 25 years I was a Prosecutor and over time one's respect for the judicial system failed to create confidence in those who have to enforce the law.

I draw particular attention to the anachronistic jury system where I2 good men and women sit, sometimes for weeks at a time, to determine the guilt or innocence of an individual. How distressing it is to know that Police, including retired police" I, are not permitted to serve on a jury because we are considered to be biased. Dopes, criminals, those who are anti police can serve on a jury and as a prosecutor with considerable experience in committals for trial It is difficult to comprehend the jury's decision of not guilty when I later speak to the arresting police who gave evidence at the committal and later tell me the ultimate result of the trial – the jury found the accused not guilty.

Police are charged by the Act of Parliament to investigate crimes yet we must advise those who commit the crime that they do not have to answer our questions Criminals, including a High Court Judge and the Chief Magistrate of New South Wales were allowed to make unsworn statements from the floor of the Court – thus denying the prosecution the right to cross examine the suspect. I have always been of the view that silence does not equate to innocence.

In the early days the Police Regulation Act stated that the Commissioner of Police hall have the superintendence of the Police Force. When **Neville Wran** became our Minister (and Premier) he added the words,"(subject to the control of the Minister)". This amendment simply interpreted unequivocally was that we then became a political arm of the Government.

Most will remember that **Jim Lees** (later Commissioner) was the officer in charge of discipline and examinations. **Premier Wran** introduced the Ombudsman Act and encouraged people who felt they had a complaint to make communication with the Ombudsman and **Wran** gave a direction that every complaint should be fully investigated. This had the effect of Jim Lees being replaced with the Internal Affairs Branch with a staff of over 30. I was heavily involved with Internal Affairs, both as a Prosecutor and subsequently as an Inspector investigator and only a very small number of complaints was justified. On being transferred to Internal Affairs, in a very short time I had 26 complaints referred to me for full investigation with many of them taking weeks to investigate and fully report to the Ombudsman. Many people, other than Police, complained that it was wrong for Police to investigate Police. Nothing was ever done to implement this insulting suggestion.

In our time we have experienced the **Justice Moffitt** enquiry, the **Wood** Royal Commission, **Black Deaths in Custody,** the termination of the **Police Cadet system,** we now see the push to increase the age of criminal responsibility from 10 to 14 – there have been many Acts of Parliament either abolished or had Police powers reduced, such as Police Offences Act, Offensive behaviour, drunkenness, indecent language, consorting, indecent publications, compulsory retirement no longer exists, on physical standards (little people under five feet as uniformed constables) and my take on all of this is that **Neville Wran** created a comic Police Service. **Wran** was certainly not the friend of our Police Service.

I believe that the Police Force I joined in 1949 was so far removed from the job it is today – you do not need university graduates – what is required is experience and common sense. I have said enough – I have made my point that all is not well – good luck to all service Police today.
