PRESIDENT'S REPORT



On 18 January I attended the 47th Anniversary Ceremony of the Granville Train Disaster . On that date in 1977 of the 410 passengers on board the train 84 perished and 213 were injured. It is the worst rail disaster in Australia's history. I laid a wreath on behalf of the RFPA in memory of the victims. My attendance was also to honour and pay tribute to the courage and bravery of the First Responders who risked their own lives in rescuing trapped persons from the wreckage.

On 13 February I attended the 46th Anniversary Ceremony of the Hilton Hotel Bombing and laid a wreath in memory of those killed in the explosion and also those who carried lifelong injuries from the result of the 1st Terrorist attack in Australia

On the I March I attended the Attestation Parade of Class 361 at Goulburn Police Academy. This was at the invitation of Police Commissioner Webb, and was the Ist time the RFPA had been represented since the Covid Pandemic, when attendances were either non-existent or restricted.

Upon arrival I was greeted by the **Principal Ch Supt Toby Lindsay APM and Inspector Nick Hallett.** I spoke briefly with **Ch Supt Lindsay** regarding the further enhancement of the affiliation of the RFPA and the Academy.

On 18 & 19 March along with Ian Lovell, George Weissel, Ian Moore and Sandy Benson I attended the Police Friendship Week at Forster-Tuncurry, where we joined with members from other Branches . As usual Charlie Halloran, the Secretary of Northern Rivers Branch assisted by Phil Knight from Dubbo branch had everything well organized for the 62+ attendees.

Whilst there the Executive met with members of the Manning Great Lakes Branch where several Awards for Service to the RFPA were presented to Branch Members.

On Saturday 23 March the **Police Legacy Gala Ball** was held at the Sydney International Convention Centre. The RFPA were well represented with members of the State Executive having a table. A most enjoyable evening which raised a significant amount of money for a most worthy cause.

In April the State Secretary, **Ian LovelI** and I will be attending the Coffs Harbour Branch Meeting. This is in keeping with our undertaking to visit as many Branches as we can to meet members face to face.

On May 17 I will be attending West Tamworth Leagues Club to support the **Bob Drew Fundraiser**. As mentioned elsewhere in this publication RFPA Member Bob Drew suffered injuries leaving him a quadriplegic. The fundraising event is being organized by the Peel & New England Branches.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

As a result of the Federal legislation controlling money laundering and customer identification, Police Bank was forced to implement KYC (know your customer) protocols at short notice. All banks are required to do this, but with our major RFPA sponsor, being the bank most of us have used for many years, the effect has appeared somewhat unfair to some. Combined with the truncation of cheque

usage (another Federal government legislative change) from 8 May 2024, It appeared to some of our Members that they were being unfairly treated. THIS IS NOTTHE CASE.

As our major sponsor, **Police Bank** was required to follow legislation and has done so, giving maximum available notice to all its customers. Other banks have had to do the same. The only way to deal with cheques now will be using PostBank, an arm of Australia Post, using its own 'clearing house' arrangements which used to be accessible to other banks through industry-wide arrangements in place for a century or more. Now some 92% of financial transactions take place using cards and common industry platforms such as Osko and BPAY and are done on line. We all need to know how to operate these functions, and the importance of personal cash in some instances has now increased. **Help is available through 131728** (**Police Bank help line)** or by using young relatives, for whom all of this is normal stuff.

These comments are included in this report merely to bring to notice the changes and their origins, and to encourage all of our Members to become involved in using such systems, which are fast becoming the substitute for cheques money orders and other such methods of payment. If you are lucky enough to win a jackpot at your club, you might have to take the cheque they are currently required to give you for big prizes to the Post Office. Likewise the Opera House Lottery prizes you might win.

Jim THOMPSON and Joanne ROBINSON of the Reef Resort at Palm Cove (just North of Cairns) have again this year donated the annual RFPA Membership Draw prize for those Members whose dues are up to date. Anyone with a direct debit or State Super deduction arranged, or has an exemption from paying dues prior to I July 2023, is up to date on the date of our 2024 AGM, and will be eligible to win the great prize. If you are an annual 'paying' Member', your 2024-2025 fees will need to be paid before 5pm on Sunday 28 July 2024 to be eligible for the prize, valued at well over \$2,000. Jim and Joanne have also made a similar donation to assist in the Bob DREW benefit on 17 May at West Tamworth Leagues Club, with the RFPA adding further value to that prize to assist Bob and Gael through their trying time. A couple of our Branches have found themselves in difficulty through lack of volunteers for some committee functions. This is regrettable, as anyone with policing experience can do all the tasks required of any of the Branch positions. What is unfair about the system is that a few willing people are often required to do the same jobs for many years, with little thought given to their advancing years or health status. There is a good deal of backup available for anyone wanting to help out, and no penalty for having to withdraw at any time.

Friendship Week at Forster in March was a great success, with **Charlie HALLORAN**, **Phil KNIGHT** and their loyal volunteers continuing (and improving annually) their traditional week of camaraderie and social events. See full details in the Articles Of Interest in this issue. **The RFPA takes pleasure in supporting this event wherever and whenever it occurs, representing our core business.**

The 2024 NSW Police Legacy Ball on 23 March at the International Convention Centre, Darling Harbour, was an outstanding event. Legatee **Phil BURTON OAM** from Human Nature again headlined the entertainment, with backing from the NSW Police Concert Band. Hearing and seeing (video) the excellent work Police Legacy does with Legatees is an uplifting experience. Congratulations to **Det Supt Donna McCarthy APM** and her dedicated team, who raised an enormous sum for Legacy and its beneficiaries.

On a sad note, Anne HAYDON, widow of the late Sgt Keith HAYDON shot at Mount Sugarloaf in 1980, passed away on 6 April. Anne had done tremendous work for Legacy during the past 24 lonely years. Rest in Peace, Cecelia Anne HAYDON.

The only downside to this story is that Campbelltown Police Area Command declined to accept their allotted allocation of Defibrillators which have now been presented and gratefully receive by Camden and Liverpool Police Area Commands.

In 1988, relatives approached the homicide squad and this investigation was reopened. Subsequently, following their diligent and thorough investigation the former husband was arrested in October 2019, interviewed and charged with murder: **Roxlyn Bowie's** body was never found. Following a Supreme Court trial, in March 2023, the former husband was found guilty of murder and sentenced to 24 years imprisonment with a non-parole period of 18 years. However, under the current NSW laws "no body — no Parole" -and because of the prisoner's age of 72, he should die in custody.


